

COLLOCATIONS: VERB + JOURNEY

VERBS+ JOURNEY	MEANING	EXAMPLES
TO BEGIN	To start a journey; to depart.	<i>We must <u>begin</u> this journey right away.</i>
TO BREAK	To stop somewhere for a short time during a journey.	<i>We <u>broke</u> our journey to have a picnic.</i>
TO CONTINUE	To go on with a journey.	<i>They <u>continued</u> their journey on foot.</i>
TO GO ON	To travel somewhere.	<i>We are <u>going on</u> a journey to a strange country.</i>
TO HAVE	To travel from one place to another.	<i>He <u>had</u> a pleasant journey despite the storm.</i>
TO MAKE	To travel from one place to another.	<i>I <u>made</u> this long journey to see you again.</i>
TO RESUME	To start again a journey after a break.	<i>You could spend the night there and then <u>resume</u> your journey in the morning.</i>
TO SET OUT ON	To begin a journey; to depart.	<i>One day the boy left the village and <u>set out on</u> a journey without destination.</i>
